Convenient weekly, evening meetings. Come late if you need. We typically finish around 8:00.

1. <u>ELEMENTS OF A TYPICAL MEETING</u>: 1. <u>OPENING</u> by **Toastmaster** (the emcee for the night). Any member can act as Toastmaster. The Toastmaster will introduce the speakers and the other administrative roles.

Look out for the **Timer.** During a speech, the Timer will show a green card to indicate that the minimum speech length is reached. A yellow card indicates that the speaker is nearly out of time, and a red card shows that the speaker has exceeded his or her speaking time.

2. <u>MEMBER SPEECHES</u> The largest portion of our meeting. Members must create and deliver 10 speeches of increasing complexity to complete their Competent Communicator manual. Non-members can observe, but not give, formal speeches.

3. <u>EVALUATIONS</u> Each speech-giver is assigned another member to act as **Evaluator**. The Evaluator makes notes on the speech and delivers a 2-3 minute oral evaluation at this time.

4. REPORTS FROM AH-COUNTER AND TIMER

At the end of this, the **Ah-Counter** delivers a report on speakers' verbal pauses (ahs, ums, etc.). Here, the **Timer** will also report on everyone's exact speech length. Some meetings include feedback from a **Grammarian** and a **General Evaluator**

____5. <u>ANNOUNCEMENTS</u> (if any)

6. TABLE TOPICS Impromptu 1-2 minute speeches. The moderator is called the **Topicsmaster** and provides prompts to speak on. The Topicsmaster can select anyone in the audience (even you!) to speak. This is your opportunity to speak in front of the group for a couple of minutes. If you don't have anything to say, just move into a topic you prefer. Your goal is to

quickly compose your thoughts into a speech.

Try to keep speaking for a full minute if you can.

7. CLOSING of the meeting by President.
